Groote Eylandt Aboriginal Trust (GEAT Inc.)

2015 (1 April 2014- 31 March 2015) Annual Report

This report is in respect of the last year under Statutory Management of Mr Phillip Timney who was appointed by the Northern Territory Government. The period of Statutory management that began on 19 October 2012 effectively ended on 3 February 2015 when the Northern Territory Department of Business confirmed the new deed and constitution had been endorsed in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Act. A fresh certificate of incorporation was issued to GEAT Inc. on the same date.

The new Deed and Constitution were the result of a period of consultation and a meeting at Angurugu of about 120 beneficiaries on the 29th October 2014 when the persons present overwhelmingly endorsed the new Trust Deed and Constitution. The most significant change was to create a new form of Association where the members of the Association were also the committee and with a mixture of beneficiaries and independent people all appointed by the Attorney General. The Attorney General has the power under the constitution to cancel an appointment of a member at any time if something is going wrong.

By 17th April 2015 all Committee members had accepted membership on the GEAT Inc. management Committee and on the 22nd April 2015 Statutory management Appointment of Phillip Timney was revoked.

The management of the trust during the financial years ending 2014 and 2015 was conducted by the Statutory Manager

Main Activities

The main activities for the 2015 Financial Year were the \$240,000 for the funding of a Bus Transport System linking Umbakumba, Angurugu and Alyangula, major upgrades and staffing upgrades to the GEAT Angurugu Market Garden and funding for 29 funerals.

GEAT Inc. Net Surplus 2015

The Net Value of the Trust including real estate as 1 April 2015 was \$50,530,885 with the Surplus for the year ending 31 March 2015 being **\$293,160**

Income

Royalty income for the year ending 31 March 2015 was \$10,412,936 this was down from \$12,503,638 for the year ending 31 March 2014. Other income streams that reduced over the corresponding period were Investments in Unit Trusts (\$284,499 from \$314,260), Insurance recoveries (\$0 compared to \$533,527 in 2014) and sales of assets went from \$452,806 in 2014 to only \$55,145 in 2015.

Incomes streams that did improve in 2015 was Interest Income which increased by \$109,106 to \$724,046 for the 2015 financial year and Rental income increased by \$45,977 to \$695,987 for the year ending 31 March 2015.

Expenses

During the Audit process the CEO and auditor agreed to writing off \$5.3 million dollars in non-Current assets. \$2.8 million of this was made off of motor vehicles and boats. The vehicles and boats were either untraceable, signed over to Individuals or considered to have had significant over evaluation of there worth at the time of purchasing. The rest of the write offs were made up of furniture and equipment, market garden equipment and earthworks, impairments of buildings and write down of the value of the GEAT barge.

Litigation

During the period of administration the Statutory Manager obtained legal opinions indicating that certain advisors did not do enough to protect the trust form over expenditure by the last committee. He commenced legal proceedings in the Supreme Court of the Northern Territory seeking to recover an amount in excess of \$30million. Your present committee is committed to pursuing this course to recover that which is due to the trust

Looking Forward

At the end of the statutory management your Trust assets were increased substantially. This fund which was created by the Church Missionary Society for the benefit of Groote Eyelandt people is now embarking on a new era. The wasteful and uncontrolled expenditure was stopped by the actions of the Northern Territory Government and now you have a committee committed to following the lawful process of managing the trust fund in accordance with the Deed and the law.

It is important to understand that because the trust is a charitable trust the law places restrictions on the way it delivers benefits to people.

The new committee will work with you to achieve the best possible results.
